STATEMENT BY DELEGATION OF SINGAPORE DURING THE UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW (UPR) WORKING GROUP SESSION ON ALGERIA ON 29 MAY 2012

Madam President,

- significant domestic undergone Algeria has developments in recent years, the most important of which was the decision by the Government in 2011 to end its State of Emergency after 19 years. Algeria has since made progress in its development and in achieving the Millennium Development Goals, which include many basic human rights. particular Algeria's achievements in providing access to primary education and health. Significant improvements have also been made in reducing the spread of HIV/AIDS. We recommend that Algeria continues its efforts to achieve the Millennium Development Goals and to improve the quality of living of its people.
- Algeria's efforts in promoting gender equality and the empowerment of women are also worth mentioning. Women in Algeria now enjoy greater opportunities for political participation. The percentage of women parliamentary members in Algeria now stands at an admirable 31% following the recent election of the National People's Assembly on 10 May 2012. According to UNICEF, women's enrolment for tertiary education in Algeria is also higher than that of men. Singapore recommends that Algeria continues to promote gender equality and to safeguard the rights of women.
