Hungary's Statement on Indonesia, UPR 13th Session, 23 May 2012

Madame President,

Hungary welcomes the delegation of Indonesia to this UPR and appreciates the key strategic reforms the Government has initiated to follow up on previous UPR recommendations. We praise Indonesia for taking a leading role in the region by launching several initiatives aimed at strengthening implementation of human rights on the ground, including establishing the ASEAN Commission on Human Rights, and initiating dialogues on the rights of the child, violence against women and the rights of peoples with disabilities.

We welcome the Government's engagement to fight impunity for human rights violations. In this regard, could the delegation elaborate on how the revised bill on Military Justice, submitted to Parliament, will help address the issue of impunity in the country? We also commend Indonesia for including the ratification of the ICC in the third phase of its National Human Rights Action Plan, and we **recommend** the Government to follow-up on this commitment and align its national legislation with the provisions of the ICC.

Madame President,

Hungary is running the resolution in this Council on reprisals. Therefore we encourage Indonesia to strengthen the protection of those who step up for the defense of human rights. In this regard we **recommend** that Indonesia continues its efforts to adopt a law to protect human rights defenders against any intimidation or reprisals as foreseen in the 2005-2009 National Legislation Programme and to ensure the prompt, impartial and effective investigation of such acts.
