

**Statement of the Republic of Latvia
13th session of the UPR
Review of Indonesia**

Madam President,

Latvia would like to thank the delegation of Indonesia for the comprehensive national report, its presentation today and their constructive engagement in the UPR process.

After studying carefully national report and other relevant documents, we note that Indonesia has made efforts to improve its cooperation with special procedures of the Human Rights Council. However, we also note that significant number of requests by special procedures mandate holders to visit Indonesia have not been accepted yet. Latvia **recommends** to Indonesia to step up its cooperation with special procedures mandate holders by responding positively to the pending visit requests of special procedures mandate holders and eventually consider extending a standing invitation to all special procedures mandate holders of Human Rights Council.

We thank Indonesia for the information contained in the national report on the progress towards fulfillment of the accepted recommendation to ratify the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court; however, we would like to note that the Rome Statute has not been ratified despite its inclusion as a priority in the 3rd National Action Plan for Human Rights. Latvia **recommends** to Indonesia to ratify the Rome Statute of the ICC and to fully align its national legislation with all obligations under the Rome Statute, including incorporating the Rome Statute definition of crimes and general principles, as well as adopting provisions enabling cooperation with the Court.
