UPR13/Indonesia/Statement by Slovakia 23 May, 2012

Mme. President,

I would like to thank the delegation of the Republic of Indonesia, led by H.E. Dr. R. M. Marty M. Natalegawa, Minister for Foreign Affairs, for the presentation of the country report and for its participation in the review process.

Slovakia acknowledges Indonesia's efforts in strengthening its institutional as well as normative framework in the area of the promotion and protection of human rights. We have taken a positive note of the adoption of the third National Human Rights Action Plan for the period of 2011–2014. At the same time, Slovakia commends Indonesia for the open national consultation process accompanying the preparation of the report and, in general, the dedication to the promotion of the role of civil society.

Slovakia would like to present Indonesia the following recommendations:

- 1. to take a resolute action against any act of religious violence and implement appropriate, efficient measures to prevent intolerance or discrimination on religious grounds,
- 2. to intensify its efforts, as addressed for example in the third Action Plan as well as the National Mid Term Development Plan 2010-2014, with a view to decrease infant and maternal mortality rates, paying a particular attention to the quality and access to family planning and reproductive health services,
- 3. to ratify the ILO Convention No. 189 on domestic workers and adopt the drafted Act for the Protection of Domestic Workers,
- 4. to ratify the Rome statute of the International Criminal Court, including its Agreement on Privileges and Immunities. We welcome the prioritization of this issue within the third National Action Plan on Human Rights for the period of 2011–2014.
- 5. Last, but not least, Slovakia recommends Indonesia to consider an early ratification of the newest international HR instrument the third OP to CRC on a communication procedure.
