Review of Ghana – intervention by Poland
(Geneva, 23 October)

Poland would like to thank the delegation of Ghana for the informative national report and its constructive participation in the UPR process. We have listened attentively to Ghana's presentation.

Noting Ghana's efforts to ensure better protection of human rights, including in the area of children's and women's rights, the delegation of Poland would like to offer the following recommendations:

- to designate a national mechanism for the prevention of torture and other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment,

- to ensure that the fundamental legal safeguards for persons detained by the police are respected,

- to undertake concrete steps in order to prevent violence against women, including domestic violence, also through awareness-raising and educational efforts;

- to enhance the prevention and combat trafficking in human beings, including internal and cross-border trafficking of women and children for the purpose of sexual exploitation or forced labour, by inter alia implementing anti-trafficking legislation, protecting victims and offering necessary help and assistance.
