In the UPR National Report of Japan, my delegation takes note of a number of important developments, such as the preparations to establish a national human rights institution in accordance with the Paris Principles, the establishment of 15 priority fields to create a gender-equal society under the Third Basic Plan for Gender Equality, the initiatives to prevent violence against women, the measures to prevent child abuse and the measures to combat trafficking in persons.

My delegation also takes note of Japan's bilateral human rights dialogue with other countries, the financial contributions to organizations such as OHCHR, UNICEF and UN Women, and its contributions to initiatives aimed at achieving the MDGs.

My delegation commends Japan's contribution to the improvement of human rights situations through dialogue and cooperation, based on the consideration that each country has its own history and traditions.
