Statement made by the delegation of the Kyrgyz Republic during the interactive dialogue of the UPR Working Group on Pakistan
30 October 2012

Madam President,

Kyrgyzstan welcomes the delegation of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and thanks them for their continued engagement with the UPR process and the comprehensive national report presented here today.

We are pleased to see that the government of Pakistan has taken many concrete steps to address restoration of civil liberties and protection of human rights, adopted a number of bills which aimed to strengthen human rights, including those on the creation of a National Commission for Human Rights in accordance with Paris Principles.
