We note the positive developments in Sri Lanka after the end of hostilities, particularly efforts exerted in re-settling IDPS, reducing security restrictions, combating recruitment of child soldiers, and holding elections in the Eastern provinces. We welcome the decision of the Government to lift the state of emergency, and other time mapped efforts to implement the recommendations of the "Lessons Learned and Reconciliation Commission" report, in addition to policies and legislation introduced within the framework of the National Human Rights Plan.

Finally, we would like to recommend the following to the Sri Lankan Government:

- 1) To implement the announced voluntary commitments and the UPR accepted recommendations.
- 2) To take further steps to ensure more participation of Sri Lankan Muslims in the reconciliation process and national efforts of economic, social, and cultural integration.
- 3) To ratify the convention on the rights of persons with disabilities, and continue steps taken to domesticate other international instruments previously acceded to.
