Consideration of the UPR Report of Sri Lanka  
Geneva, 1 November 2012

Madam President,

My delegation would like to warmly welcome the distinguished delegation of Sri Lanka and appreciates the comprehensive report.

Indonesia commends Sri Lanka for their strong determination for peace and solid commitment to the promotion and protection of human rights in the country. Despite enormous human rights and humanitarian challenges encounters in the post 30 year of conflict situation, we are encouraged by Sri Lanka's continued progress in ensuring the betterment of each and every Sri Lankan population.

Madam President,

Indonesia is of the view that Sri Lanka's continued transparency and engagement with international community is essential to enable sustained progress in the overall situation of the country. **We therefore recommend Sri Lanka to continue its constructive engagement and cooperation with the international human rights mechanism, including through technical cooperation.**

In ensuring further progress and addressing remaining challenges, my delegation also **recommends the immediate implementation of recommendations of the LLRC including on accountability process**, through Sri Lanka's National Plan of Action on Human Rights and other relevant mechanisms.

To conclude, Madam President, my delegation would like to extend its solidarity in this difficult transition period and offer its best wishes to the Government and People of Sri Lanka, in their future endeavours towards the promotion and protection of human rights in the country.
