

Statement by the Indonesian Delegation
15th Session of the Working Group on Universal Periodic Review
Consideration of the UPR Report of Liechtenstein
Geneva, 30 January 2013

Mr. President,

My delegation would like to thank the delegation of Liechtenstein for their national report and continued engagement in the UPR process.

Indonesia welcomes the establishment of several institutions to promote human rights, such as the Government's Office of Equal Opportunity, the Independent Corrections Commission, and the Ombuds Office for Children and Young People. In this regard, in order to further promote and protect human rights, we encourage Liechtenstein to step up efforts to establish a national human rights institution in accordance with Paris Principles.

Mr. President,

We take note the view of the Government of Liechtenstein as conveyed in the addendum of the Working Group Report in the first cycle of its UPR process on the recommendation to accede to the International Convention on the Protection of Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families. However, taking into account the significant number of migrants and the state's obligation to promote and protect their rights, **we recommend that Liechtenstein continue to expedite means and ways to accede to the International Convention on the Protection of Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families.**

We share the concern with CEDAW and CERD on the de facto discrimination faced by certain disadvantaged groups of women, particularly migrant women, in education, employment, health and their vulnerability to violence and abuse, as well as the lack of legislation against racial discrimination. In this regard, **we recommend that Liechtenstein consider enacting legislation prohibiting racial discrimination.**

To conclude, Mr. President, Indonesia would like to offer its best wishes to the Government and people of Liechtenstein in their future endeavours towards the promotion and protection of human rights at all levels.
