15th Session of the UPR Working Group: Review of Luxembourg

Statement by Mr. Rinchen Kuentsyl, Counsellor, Permanent Mission of the Kingdom of Bhutan on 24th January 2013

Mr. President,

My delegation warmly welcomes the delegation of Luxembourg led by to this session of the UPR Working Group. We thank the delegation for the detailed presentation of their National Report.

Bhutan appreciates the numerous measures carried out by the Government of Luxembourg, since its last UPR in 2008, to advance the human rights and fundamental freedoms of its citizens. In this regard, implementation of numerous activities, as detailed in their National Report, for the protection and promotion of human rights, especially the rights of the child, rights of disabled persons, gender equality and fight against human trafficking, are highly commendable.

Bhutan also applauds the many efforts undertaken by the Government of Luxembourg in fulfilling its human rights commitments. In this regard, ratification of international human rights instruments such as OP-CAT and CRPD are noteworthy. We welcome the Government approval of a national action plan for persons with disabilities in March this year, and the involvement of and participation by civil society and other stakeholders in this regard.
