

Statement by the Indonesian Delegation
15th Session of the Working Group on Universal Periodic Review
Consideration of the UPR Report of
the Commonwealth of the Republic of Serbia
Geneva, 30 January 2013

Mr. President,

Let me begin by welcoming the delegation of the Republic of Serbia and thank them for their continued engagement with the UPR process and its national report presented here today.

Mr. President,

My delegation welcomes the steady and firm progress conducted by the Government of Serbia in further protecting and fulfilling human rights, particularly in an-aftermath-of-conflict situation in the country. In this regard, Indonesia fully shares the opportunities and challenges faced by the Government of Serbia. Indonesia notes the comprehensive measures taken and mechanisms created by the Government of Serbia to implement its unswerving commitment in fulfilling its human rights obligations. In particular, Indonesia commends the government's efforts to adopt laws and strategies to further promote and protect human rights.

In the spirit of constructive dialogue and engagement, Indonesia would like to make the following **recommendations**:

- 1. to consider enacting the draft law on the Rights of the Child at the earliest convenience;**
- 2. to consider formulating a national human rights plan of action that unifies all efforts and stakeholders as well as streamline and mainstream all human rights programmes.**
