

## Statement by Her Excellency <u>Ambassador Graça Andersen Guimarães</u> Permanent Representative of Portugal

Mr. President,

Portugal welcomes the adoption of the General Protocol on Child Protection from Abuse and Neglect and the ongoing discussion of a comprehensive draft child rights law, and recommend its swift adoption. We also recommend that the law which will be adopted forbids corporal punishment of children in all settings, which is currently still legal in the home and in alternative care.

Portugal welcomes the recent fine-tuning of Serbian legislation provisions against sexual exploitation of children. We recommend that Serbia brings the legislation fully in conformity with the principles and provisions of the CRC, the Palermo Protocol and the Council of Europe Convention against Cybercrime and Convention on the Protection of Children against Sexual Exploitation and Sexual Abuse. In this context, we also recommend the ratification of the Optional Protocol to the CRC on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography.

Mr. President,

We recognize the Serbian authorities' efforts in the fight against trafficking in Human beings and the protection of victims, including the adoption of a protocol by the Ministry of Justice on the treatment of trafficking victims and the drafting of the new national strategy for preventing and combating trafficking in human beings and protecting victims. We recommend the swift implementation of this protocol as well as the adoption of the new national strategy.



The high number of girls among identified victims of trafficking in the last years is worrying. In this regard, we recommend the establishment of specialized shelters for children victims of human trafficking.

To conclude, Mr. President we would like to kindly inquire which steps the Serbian authorities have taken to bring its definition of torture into line with the Convention Against Torture?
