## CAMEROON UPR

Montenegro warmly welcomes distinguished head of delegation H.E. Mbonjo and the delegation of Cameroon.

Montenegro welcomes the Government decision to sign the Rome Statute of ICC, as well as OPCAT and we encourage your administration to complete the outstanding process required to ratify these instruments.

We commend the Government's comprehensive action plan to fight against FGM (female genital mutilation). However, we join CEDAW and the Committee against Torture (CAT) in urging the Government to enact the national legislation which prohibits the harmful practices of female genital mutilation.

We are deeply concerned with the increase instances of prosecution and discrimination based on homosexual behaviour and the lack of the government's action in response to threats for the human rights lawyers defending the victims. We would like to encourage the government to reinforce its efforts to ensuring the safety of all human rights defenders.

In addition, we continue to encourage the Government to fully integrate and implement the prohibition of racial discrimination in its domestic legislation.

Montenegro makes the following recommendations to the Government;

- 1) to ratify Second Optional protocol to ICCPR, aiming at abolishing of the death penalty for all crimes or formalizing the de facto moratorium on the death penalty
- 2) to extend a standing invitation to all thematic special procedures.

We wish the delegation of Cameroon all the success in the further promotion of the human rights in the country and the UPR engagement.
