## **COLUMBIA UPR - April 23**

Montenegro warmly welcomes head of delegation \_\_\_\_ and the Columbian delegation. We support Columbian's commitment to the UPR process.

Montenegro commends the Government for the significant improvments in the field of promotion and protection of human rights and freedoms through a number of policy initiatives evaluated in the OHCHR report.

We welcome the General Agreement on Ending the Conflict and Building a Stable and Lasting Peace signed between the Government and FARC that has provided the framework for all the actors to join their efforts for reaching the sustainable peace.

We welcome the cooperation of the Government with human rights mechanisms trough the regular reporting on the implementation of the accepted international human rights treaties.

We recognize that the Government has ratified the Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance in 2012. We would like to know if the Government would be ready to declare the competence of the Committee on Enforced Disappearance according to the provisions stipulated in the Article 31 of this Convention.

Montenegro makes the following three recommendations:

- We call the Government to become a party to the Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights;
- We call the Government to join the Optional Protocol to the Convention against Torture;
- We call the Government to become a party to the Third Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child.
