STATEMENT BY BOTSWANA DURING THE REVIEW OF MALAYSIA AT THE 17TH SESSION OF THE UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW

(24 October 2013, Geneva)

- 1. **Mr. President,** Botswana warmly welcomes the Delegation of Malaysia to their second UPR.
- 2. We commend Malaysia for her efforts in implementing many of the recommendations from the first review.
- 3. We note with appreciation on-going work towards accession to the remaining six core international human rights treaties, including the ICCPR, CAT and ICERD, and the decision to formulate a National Human Rights Action Plan. In this connection, the Rome Statute of the ICC would be a welcome addition.
- 4. Botswana is also pleased with Malaysia's efforts in the fight against corruption as shown by the establishment of the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission, and the adoption of the Whistleblower Protection Act 2010.
- 5. The 2012 decision to abolish school fees for primary and secondary schools is a welcome development for universal access to education. In this context, we encourage more efforts with respect to children of marginalized groups.

- 6. Botswana is concerned by reports of ill-treatment, torture and deaths in detention facilities.
- 7. We make the following two recommendations:
 - i) Strengthen measures to prevent and eliminate all forms of ill-treatment, including torture; and
 - ii) Consider ratification of the Rome Statute of the ICC.
- 8. In conclusion, we wish Malaysia success in their review and adoption of their UPR report.
