## UPR19/Democratic People's Republic of Korea Statement by Slovakia

1 May 2014

Mr President,

Slovakia thanks the delegation of the DPRK for the presentation of their national report. The situation of human rights in the DPRK is a matter of serious concern. We regret continued non-cooperation of the DPRK with UN human rights mechanisms.

Slovakia is particularly concerned with the extensive and non-transparent use of death penalty. We recommend the DPRK to introduce an immediate moratorium on the use of death penalty with a view to its abolition.

Reported cases of torture and ill-treatment of detainees in all places of detention is a matter of serious concern. Slovakia recommends the DPRK to take immediate steps to stop the use of torture and ill-treatment in all instances of deprivation of freedom.

We note restrictions on basic freedoms, including free access to information and in this regard we recommend the DPRK to ensure free access of all its citizens to information in line with its international obligations under the ICCPR.

Slovakia recommends that the DPRK allows all persons of foreign origin who have been abducted as well as their descendants to return freely to their countries of origin.

We remain concerned by reports on situation of political prisoners and conditions of their detentions in political prison camps. We call upon the DPRK to give all persons in detention a fair trial, and to release without delay political prisoners.
