

**Recommendations made by Iceland to Egypt
20th session of the Universal Periodic Review**

Mr. President,

Iceland welcomes the honourable delegation of Egypt to the UPR, and would like to make the following recommendations.

First, Iceland remains alarmed about the impunity and lack of justice following the mass killings in Raba'a square in 2013. We recommend the government of Egypt to ensure thorough, independent and impartial investigations into these incidents and to make the perpetrators accountable.

Second, we are deeply troubled by recent threats to the independence and continued functioning of Egyptian civil society, in particular human rights organisations. We share concerns on the draft bill on NGOs, and we recommend the Egyptian government to engage in broad consultations with civil society and the OHCHR to enact a new law in line with international norms and the Egyptian Constitution.

Finally, Iceland welcomes the provision in the new constitution on combating violence against women. We strongly recommend that the government intensifies its efforts to prevent violence against women, protect survivors and prosecute perpetrators.
