Mr. President,

Slovenia welcomes the distinguished delegation of San Marino to the UPR Working Group and thanks them for their presentation today. We further welcome the country's commitment to the UPR process.

Slovenia takes note of San Marino's progress and the implementation of the majority of recommendations made in the 1st cycle, in particular the ratification of the two Optional Protocols to the Convention on the Rights of the Child on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography and on the Involvement of Children in Armed Conflict.

Slovenia takes note of San Marino's progress in the field of anti-discrimination. We would nevertheless like to **recommend** to San Marino to ratify UNESCO Convention against Discrimination in Education (1960).

Following the reports from different stakeholders, we would like to ask San Marino what steps have been taken to improve the conditions of detention at San Marino Prison.

With regard to the raise of minimum age for the military recruitment to the age of 18, and following the Human Rights Committee request, we are interested to learn what steps have been taken in order to modify article 3 of act No. 15 of 26 January 1990 on the exceptional circumstances in which all citizens aged between 16 and 60 may be conscripted.
