**Statement by the Delegation of Indonesia  
At the 21<sup>st</sup> Session of the Working Group on the Universal Periodic Review  
Consideration of the National Report of Grenada  
Geneva, 26 January 2015**

Mr. President,

My delegation would like to welcome the delegation of Grenada.

Indonesia welcomes the ongoing constitutional review process in Grenada. We would like to offer our best wishes to the process and hope that the process would result to the new Grenada's Constitution that best reflect the aspiration of the people of Grenada. It is my delegation's strong conviction that the review process would extend wider and stronger protection for human rights in Grenada.

We note positively the adoption of key legislations related to human rights since Grenada's first UPR such as the Juvenile Justice Act of 2012. Indonesia believes that these legislative measures combined with their full and effective implementation would provide strong protection of human rights for the citizens of Grenada. On this basis, **Indonesia wishes to recommend the Government of Grenada to ensure the full implementation of the Juvenile Justice Act.**

We note that the Government of Grenada has ratified a number of international human rights instruments following Grenada's first UPR cycle. Indonesia believes that another international human rights instrument merits the consideration by the Government of Grenada is the UN Convention against Torture. We believe that the ratification and implementation of the UNCAT would have significant contribution towards the Government of Grenada's efforts to prevent the practices of torture. It is based on this belief that **Indonesia would like to recommend the Government of Grenada to consider ratifying the UNCAT.**

In conclusion Indonesia wishes the People and Government of Grenada all the best in their ongoing and future endeavors in the promotion and protection of human rights in their country.
