Statement of the Delegation of the Sudan
Review of Guinea
Tuesday, 20 January 2015

Mr. President,

The Delegation of the Sudan warmly welcomes the distinguished delegation of **Guinea** and thanks the honorable Minister of Human Rights ^{and Civil Liberties} for the comprehensive presentation of the national report.

The commitment and positive engagement of **Guinea** to the UPR process is highly appreciated and the information provided in the national report regarding the implementation of the accepted recommendations presented to **Guinea** in the first cycle is very encouraging. In particular the adoption of the new Constitution in 2010 that enshrined the principle of separation of powers.
