**Statement by the Delegation of Indonesia
the 21st Session of the Working Group on the Universal Periodic Review
Consideration of the National Report of Kenya
Geneva, 22 January 2015**

Mr. President,

My delegation would like to welcome the delegation of Kenya led by H.E. Mr. Githu Muigai, Attorney General of the Republic of Kenya, and thank them for the report.

In particular, we welcome the fact that the report is a result of collaborative efforts and intensive dialogue among all relevant governmental institutions as well as other national stakeholders.

Mr. President,

We learn from the report that the new Constitution, promulgated in August 2010, contains strong and important Article connected to the issue of human rights. We take note of various fundamental legislations adopted in 2010-2014 that are connected to the issue of human rights. In this regard, **we recommend Kenya to speed up the implementation of those legislations into concrete policies.**

We are of the view that the issue of poverty alleviation should continue to be one of the utmost priority of all states since it will have a direct impact to other aspect of life, including the issue of security, corruption, unemployment, as well as threat of radicalization.

Therefore we take note with appreciation various actions taken by Kenya in addressing the issue of poverty, including the establishment of Credit facilities, formulating Cash transfer, as well as enacting Fish farming Enterprise Productivity Programme and the Constituency Development fund. **In this regard, we recommend Kenya to continue the implementation of those actions, including by allocating sufficient national budget for those programs that impact directly on the lives of the people of Kenya.**

In conclusion, Indonesia wishes the People and Government of Kenya all the best in their ongoing and future endeavors in the promotion and protection of human rights in their country.
