## Mr President,

Egypt is concerned about severe deterioration in human rights situation in Turkey:

- Turkey, the main sponsor of the UN peaceful protests and assembly initiatives; witnessed the killing, injury and detention of peaceful protestors in Gezzi Park and several other occasions including Kurdish Anti-ISIS protests. Impunity still surrounds the systematic unlawful lethal use of force by the Turkish security.
- In the country that leads debate in HRC on Freedom of Expression on internet; the authorities had ordered shutting down of YouTube and Twitter, and "Social Media" was described by the Turkish leadership as "biggest trouble for the society".
- For two consecutive years, Turkey topped the world record in jailing journalists, including editors-in-chief of opposition newspapers. Moreover, the independence of the judiciary received significant blows and many concerns were raised regarding impending constitutional amendments that might compromise democracy in Turkey.
- We have concerns that some actions by the Turkish Government beyond its borders contribute to violations and abuses of human rights, and thus <u>recommend that Turkey refrains from undertaking such actions including through immediate termination of any relevant form of political, military, logistical or financial support in this regard.</u>

Moreover, Egypt recommends Turkey to:

- 1- Ensure that senior State officials refrain from public statements degrading to women and inconsistent with the Turkish constitution and Islamic values.
- 2- Release all journalists, activists, minority leaders detained solely for criticizing the Government and the ruling party in Turkey.
