STATEMENT BY BOTSWANA DURING THE REVIEW OF BELARUS AT THE 22ND SESSION OF THE UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW

(4 May 2015, Geneva)

Mr. President,

- 1. Botswana warmly welcomes the Delegation of Belarus to their second UPR and thanks them for the informative national report.
- 2. Since their last review, Belarus has undertaken legislative and policy measures to protect and promote human rights. These include the enactment of the code of civil procedure; the Trafficking in Persons Act; laws on the development of a juvenile justice system, as well as on addressing drug trafficking and drug abuse problems amongst children and young people.
- 3. We commend Belarus for measures taken to achieve the MDGs 1, 2, 3 and 4 within the appointed time frame.
- 4. Despite this notable progress, there are still a number of areas with some serious concerns. These include reports of mass arrests of protestors during demonstrations following the Presidential elections in December 2010; torture or ill-treatment of individuals during detention, and other violations of civil and political rights, including sexual violence against women detainees by inmates and officials in places of detention; and restrictions on freedoms of expression and association.

- 5. Botswana recommends the following:
 - (a) ratify the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court (ICC) and its Agreement on Privileges and Immunities;
 - (b) investigate all allegations of torture and ill-treatment in detention facilities, and take appropriate measures to bring perpetrators to justice.
- 6. We wish Belarus a successful review and adoption of their UPR report.
