Thailand welcomes the launching of Liberia's National Human Rights Action Plan in 2013. We congratulate the country's ratification of several regional and international human rights instruments, including the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

We encourage the Government of Liberia to undertake a comprehensive review of all domestic legislation to ensure full conformity with its international human rights obligations.

We are concerned that many communities, particularly those in the rural areas, still lack access to basic healthcare services, and that there are persistent inequalities and regional disparities in the distribution of health personnel and medical supplies. We therefore recommend Liberia to enhance and expand its healthcare system to cover the whole country.

We are also concerned that child rape and sexual offenses are among the most commonly reported crimes and that a high number of cases have been settled out of the court. We recommend the Government of Liberia to strengthen its enforcement of domestic laws that protect children from sexual abuses and exploitation, expedite the investigation of all reported cases, and bring the perpetrators to justice.

Thailand stands ready to join the international community in providing technical assistance to Liberia to help the country improve human rights situations on the ground.
