**STATEMENT BY THE DELEGATION OF INDONESIA  
AT THE 22ND SESSION OF THE UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW WORKING GROUP  
CONSIDERATION OF THE NATIONAL REPORT OF MONGOLIA  
GENEVA, 5 MAY 2015**

Mr. President,

My delegation thanks the delegation of Mongolia, led by H.E. Mr. Tsogoo Uugangerel, Vice Minister of Justice of Mongolia for their national report and continued commitment to advance the promotion and protection of human rights in line with previous UPR recommendations.

We also welcome the fact that the report is a result of an inclusive dialogue involving a wide range of ministries, agencies, and non-governmental organizations.

Accordingly, Indonesia is of the view that further engagement with and dialogues among relevant stakeholders, including civil society will provide an opportunity to increase common understanding of national objectives and programs, for further enhancement of national initiatives in Mongolia.

Mr. President,

Indonesia also appreciates the steps taken by the Government of Mongolia regarding the promotion of the right to employment. It is our hope that those steps will also be extended to protect the rights of foreign migrant workers. Therefore, my delegation **recommends Mongolia to consider its accession to the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of their Families, in order to ensure a comprehensive approach to migrant workers' rights.**

Indonesia takes note with appreciation that Mongolia has taken various measures in the area of protection of rights of disabled persons, including by drafting the new law on the rights of disable citizens in order to further implement all provisions under the UN Convention on the rights of Persons with Disabilities. In this regard, **we recommend Mongolia to redouble its efforts in finalizing this draft of law to guarantee the promotion and protection of rights of disabled persons, in particular to ensure their participation, to increase their employment, and to enhance their rights to education.**

At last, Mr. President, we would like to encourage the Government of Mongolia to continue their endeavors on the promotion and protection of human rights.
