Mauritania

German National Statement

Mr. President,

Germany thanks the delegation of Mauretania for its statement and the national report.

We commend the Government of Mauretania for establishing a system of asylum, including provisions to protect refugees.

Germany has, however, some remaining concerns about the human rights situation and therefore wishes to offer the following:

- 1. Follow the recommendations of the Special Rapporteur on Contemporary Forms of Slavery to abolish all remaining forms of slavery or slavery-related practices, and provide victims of such practices with the possibility to initiate criminal proceedings and obtain compensation.
- 2. Improve access to education for marginalized groups in order to improve social and economic conditions for them. One group that may benefit from this are the *Harratin*.
- 3. Provide space for civil society organizations, including NGOs, in line with international standards and best-practices, and in this respect release from prison those human rights defenders who called for the full abolition of slavery.
- 4. Increase efforts to investigate and prosecute cases of human trafficking and economic and sexual exploitation, particularly of women and children.
