Statement by Armenia

Armenia welcomes the delegation of Nauru and thanks for the national report.

We appreciate the National Policy for the protection of the rights of women. Despite some progress towards the promotion of the rights of women, women in Nauru are reported to face several challenges, among them, lack of accessible medical services. We encourage the Government of Nauru to provide the necessary medical facilities for women for early detection of health problems and appropriate intervention.

We note with appreciation that since its first review Nauru has ratified the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, Convention on the Elimination of All forms of Discrimination against Women, Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment and its Optional Protocol. Nevertheless, there still remains a number of major international human rights instruments and treaties to be ratified.

We have the following recommendations for Nauru:

1. To ratify the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide,
2. To ratify the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, and
3. To ratify the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights.
