My delegation pleases to note Nepal's strong commitment to promotion and protection of human rights in the country by ratifying 7 out of 9 Core of Human Rights Conventions, enacting and amending laws and regulations, and improving the national policy on human rights and the normative and structure frameworks in order to create favorable conditions for people to exercise their fundamental rights and freedom.
