## STATEMENT BY BOTSWANA DURING THE REVIEW OF HUNGARY AT THE 25<sup>TH</sup> SESSION OF THE UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW

(4 May 2016, Geneva)

- 1. **Mr. President,** Botswana welcomes the delegation of the Hungary to the UPR process. We thank them for their comprehensive national report.
- 2. We note with appreciation normative and policy frameworks adopted since the last review. Notable is the adoption of a new and progressive Constitution; and measures taken to combat domestic violence, and human trafficking.
- 3. We are however concerned about reports of continued discrimination and ill treatment of women belonging to national minorities and non-citizens by law enforcement officials. Reports of continued trafficking of women and girls for sexual exploitation are also worrisome.
- 4. We note positive developments in the juvenile justice system. The mandatory presence of a defence counsel for children is commendable. However, we are concerned about the suspension of juvenile courts and the lowered age of criminal responsibility from 14 to 12 years for a number of offences.
- 5. Botswana recommends the following to Hungary:

- a) Adopt measures to comply with provisions of the new Constitution including on combating discrimination and ensuring equal participation in political and public affairs by all citizens;
- b) Reinstate juvenile courts and raise the age of criminal responsibility to 14 years, for all crimes, in line with international standards.
- 6. We wish Hungary a successful review outcome.
