



**25th Session of the UPR Working Group
Recommendations by Mongolia to Hungary
May 4, 2016**

Mr. President,

While extending our warm welcome to the delegation of Hungary, Mongolia underscores with satisfaction the efforts and progress made by Hungary in the field of human rights, in particular strengthening of the Constitutional Court and ombudsman system in connection with the new Constitution.

The national report presented today not only vital in terms of highlighting Hungary's achievements but also important for encouraging making further progress towards the full realization of human rights in the country.

Mongolia is pleased to note Hungary's commitment to and constructive engagement with the Universal Periodic Review process, and tangible progress reached so far with regard to the implementation of UPR recommendations, particularly on ensuring the human rights of women, children, and the persons with disabilities.

Mongolia furthermore underlines the leadership role played by Hungary in the activities of the UN Human Rights Council in Geneva, and its continuous cooperation with the Council's Special Procedures.

With regard to international legal obligation, we are pleased to note the 2012 accession of Hungary to the Optional Protocol to the Convention against Torture, and would like to recommend Hungary to accelerate the process of accession to the International Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance.
