UPR 2 Cycle, Review of Hungary

Statement by Montenegro

Montenegro warmly welcomes distinguished (head of delegation) and the Delegation of Hungary.

We commend the establishment of social security system for families, the strategy to eradicate poverty, particularly child care benefits in schools and programs to help young childbearing women. We use this opportunity to stress the employment policy for disadvantaged groups and job creation projects for Roma.

We have noted the concerns of the CEDAW regarding women belonging to minorities, who were subject of discrimination and ill-treatment by law enforcement officials. We would appreciate if the Delegation could elaborate on the measures undertaken to protect the rights of Roma women and other minorities, and to improve their living conditions. Also, we would highly appreciate information related to concrete actions aiming to reduce trafficking of women and protection of victims who participate in the process of investigation against traffickers.

Montenegro makes following recommendations to the Government of Hungary:

- 1. To ratify the Council of Europe Convention on Preventing and Combating Violence against Women and Domestic Violence;
- 2. To ratify International Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance.
