Statement by H.E. Amb. Pedro Comissário, Permanent Representative of the Republic of Mozambique to the United Nations Office in Geneva and other International Organizations, at the 25th Session of the UPR Working Group on Tanzania

Mr. President

We wish to welcome the distinguished delegation of the United Republic of Tanzania to the Second Cycle of UPR.

Tanzania has made significant strides in the promotion and protection of human rights of Her people.

We take note of the launch of the National Human Rights Action Plan 2013-2017, a strategy aiming at promoting and protecting human rights of Tanzanian People.

We commend Tanzania for having contemplated women's rights in the new proposed Constitution, which, once adopted, will afford women with equal rights as men on inheritance, succession and land issues.

We congratulate Tanzania for the decline of albino killings for witchcraft practices, thanks to measures put in place.

On the ratification and domestication of human rights instruments, we recommend Tanzania to continue looking into the feasibility of ratifying the CAT and the Convention on the Protection of the Rights of all Migrants Workers and Members of their Families.

We would conclude by appealing to the International Community to positively respond to the request of support by Tanzania, as contained in *para* 103 of the country report.

We wish Tanzania every success in the present UPR exercise.
